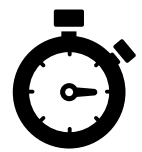

What is a Short Course?

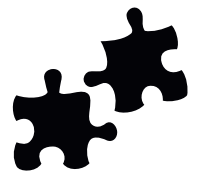
